By Mr. Coppinger of Boston, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 1603) of Edward F. Coppinger and Paul F. Tucker for an investigation by a special commission (including members of the General Court) relative to developing a youth apprenticeship program to expand pre-apprenticeship opportunities and training to secondary education students. Labor and Workforce Development.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act establishing a youth apprenticeship commission.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special laws to the contrary, there shall be 2 established a commission to examine the feasibility of implementing a youth apprenticeship 3 program in the commonwealth. The commission shall recommend best practices for developing 4 a youth apprenticeship program in order to expand pre-apprenticeship opportunities and training 5 to secondary education students. These recommendations may include education requirements, 6 methods of training and qualification, and employer standards.

7 The commission shall consist of the following members: the house and senate chairs of 8 the joint committee on labor and workforce development, who shall serve as co-chairs of the 9 commission; the house and senate chairs of the joint committee on education; 6 people shall be 10 appointed by the governor; 2 people shall be members of the house of representatives appointed 11 by the speaker of the house of representatives; 2 people shall be members of the senate appointed

| 12 | by the president of the senate; 1 person shall be a member of the department of education; 1 |
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| 13 | person shall be a member of the executive office of workforce development; and 1 person shall |
| 14 | be a member of the apprenticeship advisory group. |
| 15 | The first meeting of the commission shall convene within 30 days of the effective date of |
| 16 | this act. The commission shall meet not less frequently than quarterly thereafter and shall deliver |
| 17 | a report of its findings and recommended policies or legislation to the joint committee on |

18 education and the joint committee on labor and workforce development.
