In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act relative to promoting fair housing practices.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

	CECTION 1	a .: .		1 . 1	10		1 2012		
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2 hereby amended by inserting after the third sentence the following sentence: -

3 Every individual applicant for a license as a broker must submit proof of taking a

4 minimum of 2 hours of Fair Housing education.

5 SECTION 2. Section 87XX1/2 of said chapter 112 is hereby amended by striking out the 6 second sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:-

7 The curriculum contained in such courses or programs shall contain at least 1 hour of

8 instruction concerning fair housing laws and regulations and at least 6 hours of instructions

9 concerning or related to compliance with laws and regulations selected from any of the following

10 subjects: equal employment opportunity; accessibility for the disabled; agency law;

11 environmental issues in real estate; zoning and building codes; real estate appraisal and

12 financing; property tax assessments and valuation; and real estate board regulations.

13 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect immediately upon passage.
