### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to minor minimum wage.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 16 of Chapter 121 as appearing in the Acts of 2018, is hereby
- 2 amended by adding after Section 17 the following new section:--
- 3 Section 23: Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, employers may
- 4 be exempted from the prevailing minimum wage and shall instead pay the following figure:- \$11
- 5 if the employee is as follows; i) no older than 18 years old; ii) employed for no more than 90
- 6 calendar days after the start of employment.
