In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act to allow equal access solar net metering projects.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 138 of Chapter 164 of the General Laws	is hereby amended by
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2 inserting after the definition of "customer" the following definition:-

3 "equal access solar net metering project", the solar energy generating equipment

4 interconnected with the electric distribution system at a single point behind a single meter where

5 a customer of a distribution company's load is measured, with a nameplate capacity of not more

6 than 60kw AC, located on a parcel of land subdivided after January 1, 2010 or co-owned or co-

7 tenanted by multiple customers of a distribution company.

- 8 SECTION 2. Section 139 of Chapter 164 is hereby amended by inserting after subsection
 9 (k) the following subsection:-
- (1) There shall be no more than one equal access solar net metering project registered to a
 particular customer of a distribution company on a single parcel of land, excepting equal access
 solar net metering projects registered to publicly-assisted housing developments as defined in

13 chapter 40T, section 1; provided further that no particular customer of a distribution company 14 shall register both an equal access solar net metering solar project and a solar net metering 15 facility on a single parcel of land; provided further that the aggregate capacity of equal access 16 solar net metering projects and solar net metering facilities on a single parcel of land shall not 17 exceed 2MW; and provided further that for the purposes of calculating net metering credits, 18 market net metering credits and any incentives offered pursuant to section 11F of chapter 25 of 19 the general laws or section 11 of chapter 75 of the acts of 2016, the capacity of an equal access 20 solar net metering project shall not be aggregated with any other equal access solar net metering 21 projects or solar net metering facilities located on the same parcel of land.

SECTION 3. No solar energy generating equipment interconnected with the electric
 distribution system before the effective date of this act shall qualify as an equal access solar net
 metering project.
