An Act to recover stolen property.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Chapter 140 of the General Laws is hereby amended by adding the  
2 following section:-

3           Section 71A. Articles deposited in pawn with a licensed pawnbroker or second hand  
4 dealer that exceed market value shall be photographed and cataloged with a brief description of  
5 the item including any identifying characteristics. The office of the attorney general shall collect  
6 and maintain such information in an electronic database which shall be made available to law  
7 enforcement agencies for the purpose of identifying and recovering stolen property. The office  
8 of the attorney general shall promulgate rules and regulations to implement this section.
