In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to proactively protecting automotive drivers.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Section 8C of Chapter 90 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2012 edition is hereby
2	amended by inserting the following paragraph: Driver's license and special identification card
3	designations; persons with intellectual disabilities or autism spectrum disorder can voluntarily
4	request the Department of Motor Vehicle, Upon a signed statement by a licensed physician
5	confirming the applicant's condition, to designate an intellectual disability or autism spectrum
6	disorder on the applicant's driver's license and to designate hearing or speech impairment,
7	insulin-dependent diabetes on the applicant's special identification card
