**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to flood storage.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general special law to the contrary, the Boston  
2 Metropolitan Area Planning Council shall conduct a study of potential flood storage at the site of  
3 the former Metropolitan District Commission’s Skating Rink located adjacent to the Route 2  
4 Eastbound Lake Street off-ramp bordering the towns of Arlington and Belmont.

5           Within one-hundred-and-eighty (180) days of the passage of this Act, the Boston  
6 Metropolitan Planning Area Council shall submit a report to the Clerks of the House and Senate  
7 detailing a plan concerning implementation of such study.

8           SECTION 2. A sum of one-hundred-thousand dollars (\$100,000) shall be appropriate for  
9 the purpose of funding the study required by Section 1.
