An Act relative to dress codes in public schools \Box .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 83 of chapter 71 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "cleanliness" in line 4 the following
- 3 words:
- 4 Or b) are acting in accordance with a code of personal dress and appearance as authorized by the
- 5 school committee of each city, town, or regional school district after due consideration and
- 6 public hearing; and 1) only if said standards or code of personal dress and appearance are defined
- 7 and included in the official student handbook, or are distributed to each student and his parent or
- 8 guardian at the start of each school year, or upon enrollment, whichever occurs first; 2) only if
- 9 school officials make available resources to assist economically disadvantaged students, herein

- defined as those students who qualify for free or reduced price lunches under federal income
- 11 eligibility guidelines, to purchase clothing that meets the standards or code of personal dress and
- 12 appearance; 3) only if school officials shall afford parents or guardians the flexibility to exempt
- 13 their children from compliance with the standards or code of personal dress and appearance; and
- 14 4) only if this policy includes a provision that no student so exempted shall be penalized by
- 15 reason of such exemption.
- 16 SECTION 2. Section 86 of chapter 71 is hereby amended by striking out the paragraph and
- 17 inserting in place thereof the following paragraph: The provision of sections 83 to 85,
- 18 inclusive, shall apply only to municipal, vocational and regional school districts that accept the
- 19 same by a majority vote of the school committee, or in the case of a charter school, by the board
- 20 of trustees.
