An Act relative to death certificates.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           SECTION 1. Section 1 of chapter 46 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016  
2   Official Edition, is hereby amended by inserting in line 29 after the word “disposition.”, the  
3   following:-

4           If the deceased has been cremated and such remains have been buried, the death  
5   certificate shall indicate both the crematory and the place of final disposition of such cremated  
6   remains, if available.
