By Ms. Decker of Cambridge, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 200) of Marjorie C. Decker and others relative to childcare assistance to homeless families. Children, Families and Persons with Disabilities.

### The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act providing immediate childcare assistance to homeless families.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 15D of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2018 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following new section:-
- 3 Section 19. (a) A family placed in temporary emergency assistance shelter and receiving
- 4 TAFDC assistance from the department of transitional assistance shall be eligible for the
- 5 department of early education and care's homeless child care assistance vouchers when the
- 6 family first arrives at the shelter and at any time the family chooses while residing in the shelter
- 7 regardless of whether they meet work requirements as determined by the Department of
- 8 Transitional Assistance.
- 9 (b) A family receiving TAFDC assistance and living in a any type of shelter shall be
- eligible for a full-time child care referral from the department of transitional assistance.
- 11 (c) A letter verifying shelter residency will qualify a family receiving TAFDC assistance
- for a full-time childcare referral from the department of transitional assistance.

(d) Upon entry to a temporary emergency assistance shelter, domestic violence shelter, substance abuse and recovery shelter or non-emergency assistance shelter, children ages zero to three years old will be screened for development risk factors and/or delays. Screening standards will be established in coordination with the Department of Public Health.

SECTION 2. The department shall adopt regulations or policies for the administration of this act within 90 days of the effective date of this act.
