Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, every contract
2 which provides coverage for hospital, surgical or medical care shall provide the following
3 coverage for diagnostic screening for prostatic cancer:(i) upon the recommendation of a
4 physician, medically recognized diagnostic testing including, but not limited to, a digital rectal
5 examination, transrectal ultrasonography and prostate-specific antigen test at any age for covered
6 persons having a prior history of prostate cancer; and (ii) an annual medically recognized
7 diagnostic examination including, but not limited to, a digital rectal examination, trans-rectal
8 ultrasonography and a prostate-specific antigen test for all men aged forty and over.
