By Mr. Diehl of Whitman, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2138) of Geoff Diehl and others relative to the training and hiring standards for municipal police officers. Public Safety and Homeland Security.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

An Act to further professionalize municipal police officers and their training.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	Chapter 6: Section 116 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out the section
2	in its entirety and inserting the following:-

4	□ Chapter 6: Section 116. Definitions of terms used in Sections 116 through 119
5	☐ Section 116. The following words shall, whenever used in this section or in sections 116
6	through 119, inclusive, have the following meanings unless the context otherwise requires:
7	□(1) Commission: The Massachusetts Police Officer Standards and Training Commission
8	(MPOST) or its agency staff acting on its behalf, where applicable, or both.
9	□(2) Executive Director: The executive director of the Massachusetts Police Officers
10	Standards and Training Commission.
11	□(3) Full-time Police Officer: A person who receives an appointment to a permanent full-time
12	position in which he will exercise police powers as a municipal, University of Massachusetts, or
13	environmental police officer.
14	\Box (4) Part-time Officer: Any police officer who works less than XXX hours per [timeframe],
15	whether paid or unpaid.
16	\Box (5) Police Officer: A person empowered to exercise police powers in a fulltime, part-time, or
17	volunteer capacity with a municipal, University of Massachusetts, or Massachusetts
18	environmental police agency.
19	□(6) Recruit Training: All entry-level police academies and reserve intermittent training
20	programs.
21	□(7) Reserve/Intermittent Police Officer: A person who receives an appointment to a part-

22 time position in which he will exercise police powers as municipal, University of Massachusetts,

23	or environmental police officer, whether paid or unpaid.
24	□(8) Reserve/Intermittent Training Program: An entry-level training program operated or
25	approved by the Commission that has the prescribed course of study that a reserve/intermittent
26	police officer must satisfactorily complete prior to exercising police powers in Massachusetts.
27	
28	□ Chapter 6: Section 116A. Municipal police standards and training commission; members;
29	chairperson; nomination of executive director
30	□ Section 116A. There shall be a Massachusetts police standards and training commission within
31	the executive office of public safety. Members of said commission shall be as follows: 4 chiefs
32	of police to be appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the Massachusetts
33	Chiefs of Police Association, 1 of whom shall be from the western Massachusetts region, 1 of
34	whom shall be from the central Massachusetts region, 1 of whom shall be from the southeastern
35	Massachusetts region, and 1 of whom shall be from the northeastern Massachusetts region, the
36	chief of police of the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority Transit Police, 1 chief of
37	police selected by the Massachusetts Chiefs of Police Association, 1 police officer to be
38	appointed by the governor from nominations submitted by the Massachusetts Police Association
39	executive board, the commissioner of police of the city of Boston, the colonel of state police, the
40	attorney general, 1 person to be designated by the secretary of public safety, or their respective
41	designees, a district attorney appointed by the Massachusetts District Attorneys Association, and
42	a college faculty member in public administration or a related field appointed by the governor.
43	All such appointments shall be for terms of 3 years with their successors appointed in a like
44	manner. A member may be appointed for additional terms.
45	☐ The commission shall elect a chairperson annually and shall, as needed, provide nominations
46	for the selection of an executive director to the secretary of public safety. The secretary shall
47	select an executive director from the nominations submitted by the commission. The nominees
48	shall have practical and academic knowledge in the field of policing, including substantial
49	administrative experience and a degree or degrees in criminology, police administration, or other
50	similar field or any equivalent combination of education and experience. The position of
51	executive director shall be classified in accordance with section 45 of chapter 30 and the salary
52	shall be determined in accordance with section 46C of said chapter 30.
53	□ Chapter 6: Section 116B. Massachusetts police standards and training commission; powers and
54	duties
55	☐ Section 116B: The commission shall establish minimum police officer hiring standards,
56	including minimum age, physical and mental standards, citizenship, good moral character,
57	experience, and other such matters as relate to the competence and reliability of persons to
58	assume and discharge the responsibilities of their offices.
59	
60	The commission shall establish standards for licensure and training of municipal police
61	officers, candidates for appointment as municipal police officers, environmental law enforcement
62	officers and the University of Massachusetts police officers in accordance with applicable laws

63	and regulations, including requirements concerning courses of study, attendance, equipment and
64	facilities for police officer training; basic recruit training requirements for police officers
65	appointed on a fulltime basis; basic recruit training requirements for part-time or
66	reserve/intermittent police officers; and categories or classifications of advanced in service
67	training programs and minimum courses of study and attendance requirements with respect to
68	the categories or classifications.
69	
70	☐ The commission may grant licensure for police officers who comply with this [act] and
71	suspend said license for failure to comply with this [act] or the rules of the commission. Said
72	license may also be suspended for police officers who knowingly falsified or omitted material
73	information on an application for training or licensure to the commission; who have been
74	convicted at any time of a felony offense under the laws of this state or has been convicted of a
75	federal or out-of-state offense comparable to a felony under the laws of this state; or whose
76	license was previously issued by administrative error on the part of the commission
77	☐ The commission shall review and recommend to the secretary an annual appropriation for the
78	administration of the commission, as well as for the operations of a headquarters and regional
79	training centers, and for the delivery of standardized training at the centers.
80	☐ Chapter 6: Section 116C. Executive director; powers and duties
81	☐ Section 116C: The executive director shall be responsible for the implementation of the
82	commission's training standards, the maintenance of related training records, and the supervision
83	of staff, facilities, and day-to-day operations and shall provide the commission with a monthly
84	report regarding staff activities and police training. In addition, the executive director shall
85	oversee the development of curricula; the setting of standards for instructor certification and
86	course completion; the establishment of processes for the implementation of commission training
87	standards and for meeting other police training needs as identified by staff and the commission;
88	the inspection of the sites, records, and training for approved training programs to assure
89	compliance; and such other duties as are necessary and appropriate to carry out the purposes of
90	this section. The executive director is authorized to withhold licensure from any officer not
91	meeting the standards established by the commission, to establish reasonable fees for services as
92	permitted by law to help defray the costs of training, to enter into contracts and leases, and to
93	apply for and accept grants on behalf of the Massachusetts police training commission for
94	purposes of police training.

100	Section 117. The commission shall meet monthly and at other times when ordered by the
101	governor, secretary or chairman or upon the written request of 3 members. A majority of
102	commission members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of commission business.

03	Commission members shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for their
04	necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their official commission duties.

80	☐ Section 118. The Massachusetts police training commission shall approve or disapprove
09	municipal, University of Massachusetts, and environmental police recruit training schools and
10	
111	schools, relating to courses of study, attendance requirements, equipment and facilities and
12	qualifications of instructors and such other rules and regulations related to police training
113	standards as may be necessary. The commission is authorized to conduct site visits and inspect
14	the records of approved schools for purposes of assuring compliance with training requirements.
115	Regulations adopted by the Commission shall apply to all agencies and local governments in
116	Massachusetts that employ persons as municipal, University of Massachusetts or Massachusetts

120	□ Section 118A. It is the intent of the General Court in creating the Massachusetts Police
121	Standards and Training Commission to provide for the coordination of standards and training

137	Section 96B. Every person who receives an appointment to a position on a full-time basis in
138	which he will exercise police powers in the police department of any city or town, the University
139	of Massachusetts or the Massachusetts environmental police, shall, prior to exercising police
140	powers, be assigned to and satisfactorily complete a prescribed course of study approved by the
141	Massachusetts police standards and training commission. The provisions of chapter thirty-one
	and any collective bargaining agreement notwithstanding, any person so attending such a school

- shall be deemed to be a student officer and shall be exempted from the provisions of chapter
- 144 thirty-one and any collective bargaining agreement for that period during which he is assigned to
- a police basic recruit training school, provided that such person shall be paid the regular wages
- 146 provided for the position to which he was appointed and such reasonable expenses as may be
- determined by the appointing authority and be subject to the provisions of chapter one hundred
- 148 and fifty-two.
- 149 □ Every police officer on a full-time basis in any such municipal, University of Massachusetts, or
- 150 the Massachusetts environmental police department, shall be assigned to and shall attend a
- prescribed course of study approved by the Massachusetts police standards and training
- 152 commission for in-service officers training and continuing education at such intervals and for
- 153 such periods as said commission may determine. Any such police officer who receives an
- 154 appointment to a position of higher rank shall, in addition, complete such other courses of
- 155 supervisory training as said commission may determine. While attending such school or
- 156 completing such courses, such persons shall be paid his regular wages as a police officer and
- shall receive such reasonable expenses as may be determined by the appointing authority.
- 158 □Each person appointed as a reserve or intermittent police officer in a city or town, at the
- 159 University of Massachusetts, or in the Massachusetts environmental police shall, prior to
- 160 exercising police powers, satisfactorily complete a course of study prescribed by said
- 161 commission. Any such officer shall also be assigned to and shall attend a prescribed course of
- study approved by the Massachusetts police standards and training commission for in-service
- 163 officers training and continuing education at such intervals and for such periods as said
- 164 commission may determine. Any such police officer who receives an appointment to a position
- 165 of higher rank shall, in addition, complete such other courses of supervisory training as said
- 166 commission may determine.
- 167 Upon petition to the Massachusetts police standards and training commission by the appointing
- 168 authority, a person appointed to a position on a full-time, reserve, or intermittent basis in which
- 169 he will exercise police powers in the police department of any city or town, at the University of
- 170 Massachusetts, or in the Massachusetts environmental police may be exempted by said
- 171 commission, in whole or in part, from the provisions of this section prior to his exercising police
- 172 powers. The requirement that training be completed prior to exercising any police powers may
- 173 be waived by said commission.
- 174 □ Failure of an appointed person to satisfactorily meet the standards set by the commission and
- 175 to complete all prescribed courses of study may result in the commission withdrawing or
- 176 withholding the appointed person's license. Upon the commission withdrawing or withholding
- 177 the appointed person's license, the appointing authority shall remove the appointed person from
- 178 his position as a police officer until such time as the license is reinstated.
- 179 □ Chapter 41: Section 96C. Police officer minimum qualifications
- 180 □ Section 96C. No agency or any other person authorized by law to appoint municipal,
- 181 University of Massachusetts or Massachusetts environmental police officers in this state shall
- appoint any person as a police officer who does not meet the following qualifications. The

183	person shall:
184	\Box (1) Be a United States citizen;
185	\Box (2) Be at least 18 years of age;
186	\Box (3) Be fingerprinted. Local, state and national fingerprint files shall be searched to determine
187	if the applicant has a criminal record;
188	\Box (4) Not have been convicted of a crime for which he could have been imprisoned in a federal
189	penitentiary or state prison;
190	\Box (5) Hold a high school diploma or evidence of an equivalent achievement;
191	\Box (6) Have good moral character as determined by a background investigation. The hiring
192	agency shall complete a background investigation as defined by the commission of any applicant
193	for employment as a police officer before the applicant may be employed or begin training as a
194	police officer;
195	\Box (7) Be free of any physical, emotional or mental conditions which might adversely affect his
196	performance of duty as a police officer. Emotional and mental conditions shall be evaluated by a
197	licensed psychologist or psychiatrist; and
198	$\square(8)$ Pass an oral interview examination by the hiring agency.
199	
200	□ A person who is convicted of a felony after his appointment as a police officer is ineligible for
201	continued employment as a police officer. If the person has been licensed by the Massachusetts
202	police standards and training commission, his licensure shall be automatically revoked on the
203	date of his conviction. The executive director shall notify the person and the person's employing
204	agency upon revocation of licensure under this subsection.

208	☐ The chief of police, commissioner, or chief executive of any municipal, University of
209	Massachusetts, and Massachusetts environmental police department and the clerk of each town
210	in which no chief of police or city marshal is appointed shall, within fifteen days after such
211	appointment, notify the executive director of the Massachusetts police standards and training
212	commission of the name of any person appointed to a fulltime, reserve, or intermittent police
213	officer position and shall, within fifteen days after such actions, send to the executive director of
214	the Massachusetts police training commission the names of all the police officers, including
215	fulltime, part-time, reserve, and intermittent officers, who have resigned, retired, been
216	terminated, died, or otherwise had a change of status using forms prescribed by the commission.
217	If he neglects or refuses so to do, he shall be punished by a fine of fifty dollars.
