AN ACT TO PROMOTE HEALTHY BEHAVIORS.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2006 Official Edition,
2	is hereby amended by inserting after section 24K, the following section:—
3	Section 24L. The department shall establish a program of community based health and sexuality
4	education services provided by comprehensive family planning agencies. Said program shall be
5	designed to promote healthy behaviors among adolescents, parents and/or guardians by
6	providing science based health information and education. Community based health education
7	staff shall promote healthy behaviors within the community by providing specialized education
8	and outreach to targeted high risk populations, parents and guardians and to staff of community
9	based agencies providing services to young people. Said specialized education and outreach
10	program shall include efforts to reduce unintended pregnancy; promote abstinence in order to
11	delay adolescent sexual activity; increase parental ability to communicate with their children
12	about healthy sexuality; and reduce unhealthy risk taking behavior among all individuals.

- 13 For the purposes of the section, comprehensive family planning agencies shall be defined
- 14 pursuant to section 24E of this chapter.
