- 4 shall first be submitted to the Clerk of the Massachusetts House of Representatives for review by
- 5 the Joint Legislative Committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight and the Joint
- 6 Committee on Telecommunications, Utilities and Energy. Said proposal shall also include a
- 7 cost/benefit analysis of said regulations, taking into account economic impact on the residents
- 8 and businesses of the Commonwealth, including low-income residents. Within 30 days of such
- 9 referral, one or both Committees may conduct a hearing and shall issue a report to the issuing
- 10 agency which may contain comments and recommendations.
