## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act amending the retirement beneficiaries of Dennis Mullen.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 Chapter 316 of Acts of 2006, is hereby amended by striking out section 3 and inserting in

2 place thereof the following section:-

3	Section 3. Upon the death of Dennis Mullen should his wife survive him, the state-Boston
4	retirement board shall pay to her, so long as she remains unmarried, an annuity in the amount of
5	$\frac{3}{4}$ of the amount of the pension payable to him, per month, at the time of his death. If his wife
6	remarries, the city shall pay, in lieu of the aforesaid annuity to her, an annuity of \$ 550 per month
7	to her. If Dennis Mullen's wife does not survive him, then the city of Boston shall pay an annual
8	amount equal to <sup>3</sup> / <sub>4</sub> of the amount of the pension payable to him at the time of his death for the
9	benefit of the children of Dennis Mullen for such time as such child is either under 18 years of
10	age or totally or mentally incapacitated from working.
