An Act relative to electronic benefit transfer cards.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Chapter 18 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official Edition, is hereby
- 2 amended by inserting after section 5H the following new sections:-
- 3 Section 5I. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, eligible recipients of
- 4 direct cash assistance shall not use direct cash assistance funds for the purchase of alcoholic
- 5 beverages, lottery tickets or tobacco products. An eligible recipient of direct cash assistance who
- 6 makes a purchase in violation of this section shall be ineligible for any assistance program
- 7 administered by the department for a period of 1 month for the first violation, 3 months for the
- 8 second violation, 6 months for the third violation, and permanently for a fourth violation.
- 9 Section 5J. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, an individual or store
- 10 owner shall not accept direct cash assistance funds held on electronic benefit transfer cards for
- 11 the purchase of alcoholic beverages, lottery tickets, or tobacco products. n individual or store

- 12 owner who knowingly accepts electronic benefit transfer cards in violation of this section shall
- 13 be punished by a fine of not more than \$500 for the first offense, a fine of not less than \$500 nor
- 14 more than \$1,000 for the second offense, and a fine of not less than \$1,000 for the third or
- 15 subsequent offense. A store owner who commits a third violation of this section shall be
- 16 ineligible to accept electronic benefit transfer cards.
- 17 Section 5K. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, whoever embezzles,
- 18 steals or obtains by fraud any funds, assets or property provided by the department of transitional
- 19 assistance and whoever receives, conceals or retains such funds, assets or property for his own
- 20 interest knowing such funds, assets or property have been embezzled, stolen or obtained by fraud
- 21 shall, if such funds, assets or property are of a value of \$100 or more, be punished by a fine of
- 22 not more than \$25,000 or by imprisonment in a jail or house of correction for not more than 5
- 23 years, or both such fine and imprisonment, or if such funds, assets or property are of a value of
- 24 less than \$100, by a fine of not more than \$1,000 or by imprisonment in a jail or house of
- 25 correction for not more than 1 year, or both such fine and imprisonment."
