An Act clarifying spa regulations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Section 206 of chapter 140 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
- 2 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding after the fourth paragraph the following
- 3 paragraph:-
- 4 Every public and semipublic outdoor inground swimming pool installed prior to January
- 5 1, 1998 shall be exempt from any regulation requiring a continuous walkway around the pool
- 6 with a minimum width of four feet of unobstructed clear distance including a curb at the pool
- 7 edge if such a curb is used; provided further that such pools shall be exempt from any regulation
- 8 requiring continuous recirculation of the entire water supply so as to produce bubbles and shall
- 9 be considered in compliance with this section so long as an appropriate amount of water has been
- 10 filtered or circulated so as to maintain the clarity and cleanliness of the water.
