**In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court  
(2023-2024)**  
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An Act providing for a study relative to the necessity of certain snow safety procedures.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           The executive office of public safety and security shall conduct a study evaluating the  
2   necessity and feasibility of implementing certain snow safety procedures relative to rooftop  
3   snowfall. Said study shall include an assessment of the danger posed by heavy snowfall on  
4   building roofs and skylights, particularly as it relates to clearing snow off of rooftops, the need to  
5   address such danger, and the implementation costs and potential benefits associated with the  
6   placement of identification markers on the skylights of large buildings, which would be visible  
7   after a heavy snow storm.

8           The executive office of public safety and security shall submit a written report detailing  
9 the results of its study, including recommendations, with the clerks of the house of  
10 representatives and the senate within 180 days of the effective date of this act.
