## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to treatment for substance abuse.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1	SECTION 1.Section 51 ½ of Chapter 111 of the General Laws, as inserted by Chapter
2	52 of the Acts of 2016, is hereby amended by striking subsection (d) in its entirety and inserting
3	the following thereof:-
4	"(d) If a person has received a substance evaluation and returns to an acute care hospital
5	or emergency satellite facility within seven days of receipt of such evaluation suffering from an
6	opiate-related overdose or has recently been administered naloxone, the attending physician may
7	authorize the restraint of such person and apply for the treatment of such person for a 3-day

8 period at a facility authorized for such purposes by the department of public health or the

9 department of mental health."
