### The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act assuring municipal control of military equipment procurement by local law enforcement.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 53A<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> of Chapter 44 of the General Laws is hereby amended by
- 2 adding the following paragraph:

3 Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, no police or fire department 4 in any city or town may apply to the United States Department of Homeland Security, the 5 Department of Defense or the Department of Justice or any other body or agency to procure or 6 accept as gifts any aircraft, including unmanned aerial vehicles, armored vehicles, bayonets, 7 bombs, directed-energy weapons, grenade launchers, international mobile subscriber identity 8 catchers, launch vehicles, mines, missiles, radioactive or nuclear weapons, rockets, silencers, 9 torpedoes, toxicological agents, including chemical agents, biological agents, and associated 10 equipment, or ultrasonic devices used for crowd dispersal without the prior authorization of the

- 11 mayor and city council, in a city, or the board of selectmen, town meeting or other governing
- 12 body, in a town.
