An Act relative to reducing the income tax to 5%.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1.

2 (a) Section 4 of said chapter 62 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2010
3 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (b) and inserting in place thereof
4 the following subsection:-

5 (b) Part B taxable income shall be taxed at the rate of 5 percent.

6 (b) Subsection (a) of this act shall be effective beginning July 1, 2015.
