By Representatives Ms. Gifford of Wareham and Mr. Calter, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 2707) of Calter and others for legislation to regulate the amount of funds that may be retained on private construction projects Joint Committee on Economic Development and Emerging Technologies.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act reducing retainage on private construction projects.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 1. Notwithstanding the provisions of chapter 7, 30, 30B, or 149 or any other law, rule or
- 2 regulation to the contrary, the total amount of retainage held on non-public construction projects
- 3 shall not exceed 5% of the total amount of work performed.
- 4 Section 2. Within 45 days from the issuance of a certificate of completion or the issuance of an
- 5 occupancy certificate, all amounts retained by an owner shall be paid to a General Contractor on
- 6 a non-public construction project. Within 60 days from the issuance of a certificate of
- 7 completion or the issuance of an occupancy certificate, all amounts retained by a General
- 8 Contractor shall be paid to a subcontractor on a non-public construction project.
- 9 Section 3. In the event an owner or General Contractor holds more than 5% retainage for work
- 10 performed, or a general contractor is not paid within 45 days after final completion or a

- 11 subcontractor is not paid within 60 days of final completion on a non public construction project,
- 12 the general contractor or subcontractor shall be entitled to avail itself of any and all remedies
- 13 pursuant to chapter 93a.
