
## The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Second General Court (2021-2022)

An Act relative to establishing parity for educators.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 71B of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 12 the following section:-

- 8 Experience (Years) Education Level (B=Bachelor's; M=Master's; DOC=Doctorate;
- 9 and Cr=Credits)
