An Act relative to elections in the city of Revere \Box .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, any person seeking

2 election to public office in the City of Revere shall have his or her name appear on the ballot for

3 only one elective office that is one elective office at a time.

4 Section 2. Any person seeking election in the City of Revere as mayor, councilor at large or

5 school committee member shall have been a resident of the City of Revere for a period of at least

6 one year before the deadline for submission of the person's nomination papers to the City of

7 Revere Election Commission.

- 8 Section 3. Any person seeking election in the City of Revere as a councillor elected from a ward
- 9 shall be a resident of that ward for a period of at least one year before the deadline for
- 10 submission of the person's nomination papers to the City of Revere Election Commission
- 11 Section 4. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
