The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act providing for provisional licensure for speech-language pathologists.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 112 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2014 Official
- 2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after section 144A, the following section:-
- 3 Section 144B. (a) The board shall issue a provisional license as a speech-language
- 4 pathologist to each applicant who meets the requirements set forth in this section. It shall issue
- 5 the provisional license to each person so licensed, which shall be conclusive evidence of the right
- 6 of such person to practice for a period of supervised professional practice in the area in which a
- 7 license under section 144 is being sought and required by the national certifying body for
- 8 speech-language pathology. The provisional license shall be valid for no longer than the period
- 9 of supervised professional practice.

- 10 (b) To be eligible for license by the board as a speech-language pathologist 11 , an applicant shall:
- 12 (1) be of good moral character; and

- (2) possess at a minimum (a) a bachelor's degree or its equivalent and (b) a master's degree or its equivalent in the area of speech-language pathology granted by an educational institution which incorporates academic course work and the minimum hours of supervised training required by the national certifying body for speech-language pathology.
- (c) The applicant for the provisional license as a speech-language pathologist shall apply to the board in writing on an application form prescribed and furnished by the board. At the time of filing the application, an applicant for a provisional license shall pay to the board a fee which shall be set by the secretary of administration and finance.
- 21 SECTION 2. Section 146 of said chapter 112is hereby amended by inserting in line 3, 22 after the words "section 144", the following words:- or section 144B,.
- 23 SECTION 3. Said section 146 of said chapter 112 is hereby amended by inserting in line 9, after the words "section 144" the following words:- or section 144B,.
 - SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any general or special law, or rule or regulation to the contrary, insurance companies shall accept the provisional license of a speech-language pathologist as a full license for the purpose of credentialing clinicians.
