**In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court
(2017-2018)**

An Act relative to student safety in interscholastic athletic activities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 54A of chapter 71 of the general laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting after the words “eleven C“ the following: -

4 “, or a licensed athletic trainer, who has completed the annual head injury safety training,
5 as required by 105 CMR 201.007,”

7 SECTION 2. Said Section 54A is further amended by adding at the end thereof a new
8 paragraph:-

10 “A licensed athletic trainer shall be employed by a superintendent or school committee at
11 every high school in the commonwealth offering interscholastic athletic activities.”
