The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to effective resource allocation in schools.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Chapter 70 of the General Laws, as	s appearing in the 2014 Official Edition,
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2 is hereby amended by inserting after section 4 the following section:-

3 Section 4A. (a) The department, in consultation with the executive office of education, 4 shall a convene data advisory committee to promote the improved use of school-level data to 5 inform effective resource allocation decisions at the local level. The data advisory committee 6 shall include, but not be limited to, a representative from the following organizations: the 7 Massachusetts Association of School Committees, Inc.; the Massachusetts Association of School 8 Superintendents, Inc.; the Massachusetts Association of School Business Officials, Inc.; the 9 Massachusetts Association of Vocational Administrators, Inc.; and the Massachusetts 10 Association of Regional Schools, Inc. The data advisory committee shall assist the department to 11 identify, advise and analyze cost-effective ways to achieve the following goals including, but not 12 limited to: (i) streamlining financial reporting, eliminating duplicate reporting requirements and

13 improving data quality; (ii) strengthening the department's capacity to analyze and report 14 staffing, scheduling and financial data in ways that support strategic resource allocation 15 decisions at the district and school level; (iii) strengthening district capacity to use data to make 16 strategic resource allocation decisions; and (iv) establishing a data collection and reporting 17 system that: (1) tracks funding allocated for English language learner and low-income students to 18 ensure that spending is targeted to the intended populations and to provide a data source for the 19 foundation budget review commission about the accuracy and adequacy of the low-income and 20 English language learner increments; and (2) allows for access to school-level expenditures and 21 data across all districts to inform the public and policy-makers about effective school-level 22 interventions and investments.

(b) The data advisory committee shall report its progress to the board, the senate and
house chairs of the joint committee on education and the chairs of the senate and house
committees on ways and means not less than semiannually, by December 1 and June 1, and shall
make recommendations as necessary for the department to achieve the goals of this section. The
department may, in consultation with the data advisory group, develop or procure the data
collection and reporting system under clause (iv) of subsection (a).
