The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Thirteen

Resolve providing for the creation of a special commission relative to the seal and motto of the Commonwealth.

- 1 Resolved,
- 2 That a special commission is hereby established (1) for the purpose of investigating the
- 3 features of the official seal and motto of the commonwealth including those which have been
- 4 controversial or misunderstood or are no longer meaningful to the citizens of the commonwealth
- 5 and (2) for the purpose of examining the seal and motto of the commonwealth to determine that
- 6 they accurately reflect and embody the historic and contemporary commitments of the
- 7 commonwealth to peace, justice, liberty and equality, and to spreading the opportunities and
- 8 advantages of education.
- 9 Said commission shall make recommendations regarding a revised or new design of the
- 10 seal of the commonwealth and a revised or new motto of the commonwealth, as described in
- 11 chapter two, sections two to six, inclusive, of the General Laws, if deemed appropriate, and shall
- 12 propose and design an educational program on the history and meaning of the seal and motto.
- 13 Said commission shall consist of two members of the senate, three members of the house
- 14 of representatives, the secretary of the commonwealth or his designee, the executive director of
- 15 the Massachusetts historical commission or his designee, the executive director of the council on
- 16 arts and humanities or his designee, the chair of the Massachusetts arts commission or his

17 designee, and five persons to be appointed by the governor, three of whom shall be of native
18 American descent of Massachusetts tribes to be selected from a list of six nominees to be
19 submitted by the executive director of the commission on Indian affairs.

20 Said commission shall report to the general court the results of its investigation and
21 study, and its recommendations, if any, together with drafts of legislation necessary to carry its
22 recommendations into effect, by filing the same with the clerk of the house of representatives on
23 or before the first Wednesday of December, 2012. Said commission shall not receive funds
24 appropriated by the commonwealth, provided, however, that they may seek, accept and expend
25 any grants or gifts of money, professional services, consultant services, clerical and other
26 services and supplies from the federal government or any other private or public source in the
27 course of its investigation and study.
