In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act to improve water sub-metering in manufactured housing communities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 40 of the General Laws, is hereby amended by inserting the
- 2 following new section at the end thereof:
- In order to assist with assuring that all residents residing in Manufactured Housing are
- 4 treated equally and to preserve scarce natural resources, water sub metering may be required by
- 5 the owner or operator of any Manufactured Housing Community in the Commonwealth; in the
- 6 event that such owner or operator elects to do this, each and every resident shall be required to
- 7 share equally in any and all costs associated with such sub-metering and provided, further, that
- 8 notwithstanding that this is a capital cost, this cost may be recouped by the owner or operator at
- 9 the time of installation of the sub-metering and shall not be collected as though it were a capital
- 10 cost.
