**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act relative to transit.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 2 of Chapter 23A of the General Laws is hereby amended by
2 inserting the following new subsection:

3 (g) to coordinate with the MBTA and the regional transit authorities to insure transit
4 services are available to employees of existing and expanding businesses throughout the
5 Commonwealth.
