An Act creating a scholarship fund to increase the number of medical providers who are knowledgeable in autism.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule, or regulation to the contrary, there is  
2 hereby established a scholarship fund to increase the number of medical providers who are  
3 knowledgeable in autism. Individuals eligible for applying for the scholarship are students  
4 attending the university of Massachusetts medical school, state run/public nursing schools, and  
5 schools of state run/public dentistry schools who are either studying issues related to autism  
6 and/or plan to work with individuals with autism upon graduation. Three scholarships total will  
7 be awarded annually: one to a student attending the university of Massachusetts medical school,  
8 one attending a state run/public nursing program, and one attending a state run/public dentistry  
9 school.
