Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Subsection (a) of part B of section 3 of chapter 62 of the General Laws, as
- 2 appearing in the 2006 Official Edition, is hereby amended by adding the following paragraph:-
- 3 (16) An amount equal to 50 percent of the total condo fees paid on an annual basis, not to exceed
- 4 the amount of \$3,000 in the case of an individual who pays condo fees for his principal place of
- 5 residence and such residence is located in the commonwealth, for a person who qualifies as a
- 6 head of household under section 2 (b) of the code, or for a husband and wife.
