Kafka and others providing for an investigation and study to identify existing structural or policy-based impediments to delivering a more comprehensive and efficient transportation system for the senior, disabled, and veteran populations . Transportation.

The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act establishing an taskforce on the transportation of elders, veterans, and those with disabilities.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. There shall be a special task force convened to identify existing structural
- 2 or policy-based impediments to delivering a more comprehensive and efficient transportation
- 3 system for the senior, disabled, and veteran populations of the Commonwealth.
- 4 The task force shall consist of 12 members: 1 of whom shall be the Secretary of Elder
- 5 Affairs or their designee, who shall serve as chair; 1 of whom shall be the Secretary of Veterans
- 6 Affairs or their designee; 1 of whom shall be the Secretary of Transportation or their designee; 1
- 7 of whom shall be a representative of the Massachusetts Councils on Aging; 1 of whom shall be a
- 8 representative of the Disabled Persons Protection Commission; 1 of whom shall be a
- 9 representative of the Massachusetts Bay Transit Authority; 1 of whom shall be a representative
- 10 of the Massachusetts Regional Transit Authorities; 1 of whom shall be a representative of the
- 11 Massachusetts Municipal Association; 1 of whom shall be a representative of the Disabled

- 12 American Veterans Department of Massachusetts; 1 of whom shall be a representative of the
- 13 Massachusetts Office on Disability; 1 of whom shall be a representative of the Human Service
- 14 Transportation Office; and 1 of whom shall be a representative of HESSCO Elder Services.
- In its examination, the task force shall review how transit service is currently provided to
- 16 the senior, disabled, and veteran population of the Commonwealth by both public and private
- 17 means and identify problems owing to redundancy and overlapping jurisdictions/service areas in
- 18 both the scheduling and delivery of transportation services. The task force shall then draft
- 19 recommendations to improve the way transportation is provided to the elder, disabled, and
- 20 veteran populations in a more efficient, cost-effective manner.
- 21 The task force shall submit its report, findings, recommendations and any proposed
- 22 legislation and regulatory changes to the Governor, the joint committee on Elder Affairs, and the
- 23 joint committee on Transportation not later than July 1, 2016.
