The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act directing the Department of Education to include a course in civics as a high school graduation requirement.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1: Section 2 of Chapter 71 of the General Laws is amended, in line 7, by
- 2 inserting after "... for the duties of citizenship." The following:
- The successful completion of a course in civics shall be mandated as a requirement for all
- 4 students in order to receive their high school diploma. The department of education shall set
- 5 guidelines for all school districts relative to the implementation of the civics course. At
- 6 minimum, the course must educate students in the following criteria: Composition of local, state,
- 7 and federal government,

- 8 Function of the branches of local, state, and federal government, Responsibilities and
- 9 duties as an American citizen, Opportunities for voter participation, Exposure to current events
- 10 and identification of government officials
- SECTION 2: The department shall take all reasonable efforts to accomplish the
- 12 establishment of necessary regulations by May 1, 2015, in order that the provisions of this act
- 13 may be implemented in the following school year.
