By Mr. Schmid of Westport, a petition (accompanied by bill, House, No. 3084) of Paul A. Schmid, III and others relative to a reduction in fees for motor vehicle veteran registration plates. Transportation.

**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**

An Act to reduce the fee for motor vehicle veteran registration plates.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1: Paragraph 15 of section 2 of said chapter 90 of the General Laws, as  
2 appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is hereby amended by striking out the words in line 397 -  
3 399, “There shall be an annual \$20 fee for such "VETERAN" plates in addition to the established  
4 registration fee for private passenger motor vehicles and motorcycles” and inserting in place  
5 thereof the following:-

6 “The fee for such “VETERAN” plates shall be the established registration fee for private  
7 passenger motor vehicles and motorcycles.”

8 SECTION 2: Notwithstanding any other general or special law, or regulation to the  
9 contrary, the fee for the issuance or renewal of motor vehicle “VETERAN” registration plates  
10 under paragraph 15 of section 2 of chapter 90 of the General Laws, as amended by section 1 of  
11 this act, shall not be increased by any additional registration or special fees.

12 SECTION 3: This act shall take effect 270 days after its passage.
