Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Section 2A of chapter 71B of the general laws is hereby amended by adding the

4 (f) The director, under the direction and supervision of the chief administrative

- 5 magistrate, shall hire an attorney to serve as pro se facilitator who shall provide unrepresented
- 6 parents with oral and written information, but not legal advice or representation, so that they may
- 7 access the bureau's dispute resolution processes.
