## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court (2015-2016)

An Act authorizing the town of Norfolk to continue the employment of fire chief Coleman Bushnell.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:* 

1 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any general or special law to the contrary, Coleman Bushnell, Chief of the Fire Department of the Town of Norfolk, may continue to serve in such 2 3 position until March 28, 2022, until the date of his retirement, or until the date he is relieved of his duties by the Board of Selectmen, whichever occurs first; provided, however, that he is 4 mentally and physically capable of performing the duties of his office. The Board of Selectmen 5 may, as its own expense, require that Coleman Bushnell be examined by an impartial physician 6 designated by them to determine such capability. No further deductions shall be made from the 7 regular compensation of Coleman Bushnell under Chapter 32 of the General Laws for any 8 service subsequent to the Chief reaching age 65, and upon retirement, he shall receive a 9 superannuation retirement allowance equal to that which he would have been entitled had he 10 retired on his date. 11

# 12 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
