In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act relative to half-staff notifications.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- Section 6A of Chapter 2 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2016 official edition is hereby amended by adding at the end the following paragraph:-
- 3 (h) All military service members (Army, Air Force, Coast Guard, Marine Corps, Navy,
- 4 National Guard, and Reserves) residing in Massachusetts, and performing military duty under
- 5 official orders, who are killed while in an active duty status, will be honored by having flags
- 6 throughout the Commonwealth flown at half-staff from the day of death until sunset of the day
- 7 of interment in accordance with such orders or instructions as may be issued by, or at the
- 8 direction of the governor. The remains of POWs/MIAs repatriated within the Commonwealth
- 9 shall have the flag half-staffed on the day of arrival within the Commonwealth through the day
- of internment. Additionally, flags will be half-staffed each year on national POW/MIA Day,
- observed across the nation on the third Friday of September, from sunrise to sunset.
