The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act directing the office of the inspector general to conduct a study of leasing practices utilized by the Massachusetts Water Resources Authority.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. The inspector general is hereby authorized and directed to expend an amount not
2 exceeding \$150,000 to study all Massachusetts water resources authority leasing agreements in
3 which the authority is either the lessor or lessee of real property. This study shall include, but not
4 be limited to, an analysis, appraisal, evaluation and listing of all real property owned or under the
5 control of the authority and shall detail whether such property is generating a positive or negative
6 economic impact for ratepayers in the authority's district. Said study shall document whether all
7 such real property leases have been authorized in accordance with all applicable or generally
8 accepted principles of advertising and procurement. The inspector general shall include his

9 recommendations for improving real property oversight at the authority and, if indicated by his
10 findings, shall provide draft legislation to improve administration in this area to ensure the
11 authority is receiving the maximum feasible return and is applying the same for the benefit of
12 ratepayers. The inspector general shall complete this study no later than October 15, 2007 and
13 shall submit his findings and recommendations to the house and senate committees on ways and
14 means not later than December 15, 2007.
