Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 Section 1. Section 6 of chapter 64H of the General Laws, as most recently amended by
2 chapter 68 of the acts of 2011, is hereby further amended by striking in paragraph (rr), the word
3 “commercial”.
