**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court  
(2015-2016)**  
—————

An Act providing the retirement board of the City of Cambridge to grant creditable service to Kenneth T. Mui, Andrew Topouzoglou, Steven DeMarco, and Anthony Cacciola.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Notwithstanding any general or special law, rule or regulation to the contrary, the  
2 Retirement Board of the City of Cambridge shall credit Kenneth T. Mui with creditable service  
3 for the period of July, 1997 to May, 2005, Andrew Topouzoglou with creditable service for the  
4 period of May, 1999 to May, 2005, Steven DeMarco with creditable service for the period of  
5 July, 1990 to April, 1993, and Anthony Cacciola with creditable service for the period of May,  
6 1999 to June, 2000, inclusive for the purpose of determining their superannuation retirement  
7 allowance pursuant to paragraph (a) of subdivision (2) of Section 5 of Chapter 32 of the General  
8 Laws. Before the date that any retirement allowance become affective in the case of Kenneth T.  
9 Mui, Andrew Topouzoglou, Steven DeMarco, and Anthony Cacciola, each shall pay into the

10 annuity savings fund of the retirement system of the city in 1 sum or installments, upon such  
11 terms and conditions as the board may prescribe, an amount equal to that which would have been  
12 withheld as regular deductions from their regular compensation for such previous service, plus  
13 interest.
