In the One Hundred and Ninetieth General Court (2017-2018)

An Act relative to firefighter training.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 Chapter 32 of the General Laws as appearing in the 2014 Official Edition is hereby
- 2 amended by adding at the end of Section 91 the following paragraph:-
- 3 (f) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (a) to (d) inclusive, a retired firefighter
- 4 may be employed by the Department of Fire Services in any capacity in excess of 960 hours.
