The Commonwealth of Alassachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act allowing narcotics testing products.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1: Chapter 94C of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting after section 34A the following section:-
- 3 Section 34B. (a) Any person may provide, administer, or utilize a narcotics testing
- 4 product to assist another person in determining whether a narcotic or substance contains
- 5 chemicals, toxic substances, or hazardous compounds. Narcotics testing products shall include,
- 6 but not be limited to, fentanyl test strips.
- 7 (b) A person who provides, administers, or utilizes a narcotics testing product to assist
- 8 another person shall not be subject to civil liability or criminal prosecution as a result of
- 9 providing, administering, or utilizing the narcotics testing product to assist another person.
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage.
