An Act relative to certain elections in the city of Newton.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1 SECTION 1. Section 8-3 of the charter of the city of Newton, which is on file in the  
2 office of the archivist of the commonwealth as provided by section 12 of chapter 43B of the  
3 General Laws, is hereby amended by striking out subsection (a) and inserting in place thereof the  
4 following subsection:-

5 (a) Date – For each regular city election and any special election called to fill a vacancy  
6 in the office of mayor, there shall be held a preliminary election for the purpose of nominating  
7 candidates. The board of aldermen shall set the date for each preliminary election.

8 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
