An Act relating to public access to historical records.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:*

1           Section 7 of Chapter 66 of the General Laws is hereby amended by inserting at the end  
2 thereto the following sentence: All records in the custody of the state secretary accessioned from  
3 state institutions for people with intellectual or developmental disabilities or mental health  
4 conditions in the commonwealth shall be open to public inspection and available for copying  
5 after the expiration of seventy-five years from creation of the record.
