The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-First General Court (2019-2020)

An Act providing municipal control of liquor licenses.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- SECTION 1. Chapter 138 of the General Laws is hereby amended by striking out section
- 2 17 and inserting in place thereof the following section:-
- 3 SECTION 2. For each city or town that has voted to grant licenses for the sale of
- 4 alcoholic beverages as provided in section 11, the legislative body of the city or town shall
- 5 determine the number of licenses issued in the city or town under sections 12 and 15. Cities or
- 6 towns that have voted to grant licenses, as provided in section 11, may grant seasonal licenses
- 7 under section 12 in a number determined by the legislative body. Cities or towns that have voted
- 8 to grant licenses as provided in section 11 may grant licenses under sections 12, 15 or 15F to the
- 9 holder of a farmer-winery license under section 19B in a number determined by the legislative
- 10 body.

- SECTION 3. Sections 17A, 7B and 17C of said chapter 138 are hereby repealed.
- SECTION 4. The number of licenses for the sale of alcoholic beverages allowed by prior
- law shall continue in force until changed by the legislative body under section 17 of chapter 138
- of the General Laws.
