Proposal for a legislative amendment to the Constitution relative to qualifications of voters.

A majority of all the members elected to the Senate and House of Representatives, in joint session, hereby declares it to be expedient to alter the Constitution by the adoption of the following Article of Amendment, to the end that it may become a part of the Constitution [if similarly agreed to in a joint session of the next General Court and approved by the people at the state election next following]:

ARTICLE OF AMENDMENT.

- 1 Article III of the Amendments to the Constitution, as most recently amended by Article
- 2 CXX of the Amendments to the Constitution, is hereby further amended by inserting after the
- 3 word "conviction" the following words:- of indecent assault and battery on a child, attempt to
- 4 commit murder by poison, drowning or strangulation, murder, manslaughter or assault with
- 5 intent to commit rape, or for which the person may be punished by imprisonment in a state
- 6 prison for life.
