RESOLVE An Act relative to responsible prescription prescribing

Resolved,

- 1 There is hereby established a special commission to investigate responsible prescription practices
- 2 in Massachusetts. The commission shall consist of 3 members of the house of representatives, 1
- 3 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the house of representatives; 3 members of
- 4 the senate, 1 of whom shall be appointed by the minority leader of the Senate; 1 representative
- 5 from the executive office for administration and finance; the commissioner of public health drug
- 6 control program or the commissioner's designee; the director of the prescription monitoring
- 7 program or the director's designee; and 3 members appointed by the governor that represent the
- 8 medical and pharmaceutical community with specialty experience in drug regulation,
- 9 prescription, treatment and abuse. The commission's investigation, shall include, but not be
- 10 limited to best practices for responsible prescription. The commission shall submit a report of its
- 11 findings, including legislative recommendations, if any, to the joint committee on public health
- 12 and the house and senate committees on ways and means by April 15, 2012.
