## The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the One Hundred and Ninety-Third General Court (2023-2024)

An Act relative to setting deadlines to electrify the commuter rail.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1.
- 2 Section 1 of Chapter 90 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2022 Official Edition, is

3 hereby amended by adding the following definitions:-

4 "Zero-emission infrastructure" means electric multiple units, electric battery chargers,

5 trolleybus and railway catenary wire, and other equipment to support the operation of electric

- 6 vehicles.
- 7 SECTION 2.
- 8 Chapter 21N is hereby amended by inserting after Section 7, the following sections:
- 9 Section 7½. To contribute to the Commonwealth's greenhouse gas reduction targets, the
- 10 Secretary, in consultation with the department of energy resources, department of transportation,

11	department of environmental protection, department of public utilities, and intergovernmental
12	coordinating council established by the Acts of 2022, chapter 179, section 81 shall enforce
13	targets for public fleet electrification.
14	(a)The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority and its commuter rail contractor
15	shall operate a fully electric commuter rail system by December 31, 2035 and ensure sufficient
16	zero-emission infrastructure is in place to accomplish said timeline.
17	SECTION 3.
18	Chapter 161A is hereby amended by inserting the following paragraphs in section 7 after
19	the term "under Section 6C":
20	(a) The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall implement electrification
21	along all commuter rail lines by no later than December 31, 2035 and according to the below
22	interim deadlines for each phase. Commuter rail lines serving environmental justice populations
23	as defined in section 62 of chapter 30 of the General Laws shall be the first lines to electrify in
24	Phase I. In Phase I, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall operate electric trains
25	on the Fairmount Commuter Rail Line from South Station to Readville Station,
26	Newburyport/Rockport Line through Beverly Station and the entire Providence/Stoughton Line
27	by December 31, 2024. Not later than November 1, 2023, the Massachusetts Department of
28	Transportation should begin construction on the Fairmount corridor Newburyport/Rockport Line
29	environmental justice corridor to support rail electrification. In Phase II, the Massachusetts Bay
30	Transportation Authority shall operate electric trains on the Framingham/Worcester Line by
31	December 31, 2026. In Phase III, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall operate
32	electric trains on the Middleborough/Lakeville Line by December 31, 2027. In Phase IV, the

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33	Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall operate electric trains on the remaining routes
34	listed below and remaining sections of the Newburyport/Rockport Lines by December 31, 2035:
35	(1) South Coast
36	(2) Haverhill
37	(3) Lowell
38	(4) Fitchburg
39	(5) Franklin/Foxboro
40	(6) Kingston
41	(7) Greenbush
42	(8) Foxboro Event Service

45	The MBTA governing board of directors shall monitor the progress of electrifying the
46	commuter rail fleet in four phases.
47	SECTION 4.
48	The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall implement service frequency
49	standards to ensure that rail electrification technology meets the goals of a regional rail system.
50	By December 31, 2029, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall have the ability to
51	operate service on the Fairmount Line, Newburyport/Rockport Line through Salem Station, and

52 the Providence/Stoughton Line every 7.5 minutes in each direction. By December 31, 2029, the 53 Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall have the ability to operate service on the 54 Newburyport/Rockport Line branches from Beverly Station to Newburyport/Rockport every 15-55 30 minutes in each direction. By December 31, 2029, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation 56 Authority shall have the ability to operate service on the Worcester Line through Framingham 57 Station every 15 minutes in each direction. By December 31, 2029, the Massachusetts Bay 58 Transportation Authority shall have the ability to operate service on the remaining Lines and 59 portions of Lines not mentioned above every 30-60 minutes in each direction. By December 31, 60 2035, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority shall have the ability to operate service on 61 the Fairmount Line, Newburyport/Rockport Line through Salem Station, the 62 Providence/Stoughton Line, and the Worcester Line through Framingham Station every 5 63 minutes in each direction. By December 31, 2029, the Massachusetts Bay Transportation 64 Authority shall have the ability to operate service on the remaining Lines and portions of Lines 65 not mentioned above every 15 minutes in each direction. The Massachusetts Bay Transportation 66 Authority Board of Directors shall monitor the progress of the implementation of the service 67 frequency standards.

The Massachusetts Bay Transportation Authority and Massachusetts Department of
Transportation shall submit applications, as appropriate, for federal funding to accomplish zero emission infrastructure and electric commuter rail operation.
