The Commonwealth of Massachusetts

In the Year Two Thousand Eleven

An Act further supporting Massachusetts military families .

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 35CC of chapter 10 of the General Laws, as appearing in the 2008 Official
2 Edition, is hereby amended by inserting, after the word “families” in line 6, the following
3 words:- ,including the Gold Star Families of certain active duty members of the armed forces,
- 4 SECTION 2. Said section 35CC of said chapter, as so appearing, is hereby further amended by
5 striking out the third sentence and inserting in place thereof the following sentence:- Revenues
6 credited to the fund under this section shall remain in the fund, not subject to appropriation, for
7 application to those purposes and for expenses related to the administration and operation of the
8 fund.
- 9 SECTION 3. Section 13 of chapter 130 of the acts of 2005 is hereby amended by adding at the
10 end thereof the following sentence:- The Friends of the Massachusetts National Guard and

11 Reserve Families, Inc. shall be designated as a first responder program for Massachusetts Gold
12 Star Families.

13 SECTION 4. Paragraph (2) of subsection (a) of section 14 of said chapter 130 of the acts of
14 2005 is hereby amended by striking out the words “name, address, rank and rating” and inserting
15 in place thereof the following words:- servicemember’s city or town .

16 SECTION 5. Said section 14 of said chapter is hereby further amended by striking out
17 subsection (b) and inserting in place thereof the following subsection:-

18 (b) The information provided pursuant to this section shall be public records.

19 SECTION 6. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
